

INTRODUCTION

by Markos Ph. Dragoumis

The songs included here were recorded in 1965 by John Anninos and Markos Dragoumis for the collection of the Melpo Merlier Music Folklore Archives in Athens. The mission was supported in many ways by J. Mazarakis then the governor of the Kastoria prefecture. The fact that Vogatsikò, from the 18th century onwards, was in close contact with various large cities, such as Salónika and Constantinople, has influenced the style of its music. Thus many of its songs have a marked urban flavour. The last song of this anthology was recorded in the 1980's by the ethnographer Philimon Hatzis, who at the time was visiting Vogatsikò and other surrounding villages to supplement the work done in 1965 by the Music Folklore Archives.
